# Europe and the World Winter School 2026

## Security Challenges for the EU in Turbulent Times

9–13 February 2026 | Universidad Complutense de Madrid

The school is designed to be a dynamic and reflective space in which to explore crucial issues concerning the different dimensions and challenges facing Europe in the field of security. Through a five-day intensive problem-solving exercise and with a multidisciplinary approach, the Winter School programme aims to raise awareness and promote dialogue on these global challenges. Under the guidance of academics and practitioners, students will analyse the outcomes of current policies and develop recommendations to address pressing challenges, such as the complexities of implementing a new European defence policy, the debate on the relationship between security and migration, and concerns about how to address critical dependencies and improve energy security.

After an opening session, the students will attend lectures and panel discussions on the key issues addressed. The analysis will be carried out both through the formation of working groups with the participating students, and through roundtable discussions with leading experts. In particular, there will be three roundtable discussions with panels of experts, one for each of the three main themes of the WS. This activity will significantly enhance the quality of our education, research and outreach through interdisciplinary and multicultural collaboration.

By bringing together students and academics from different European universities, the school will promote collaborative work and peer learning, facilitating the exchange of best practice and pedagogical innovation. The combination of theoretical and practical approaches to critical issues relating to migration flows, European defence challenges and strategic dependencies will enrich both teaching and research. Moreover, the focus on relevant contemporary problems will strengthen our social impact and promote active engagement in addressing global and European challenges. This collaborative environment will also set new standards of quality and create opportunities for future projects and strategic alliances.

The Winter School offers an interdisciplinary approach, allowing students to explore complex issues from different perspectives (political, economic, social, environmental). Students will combine plenary lectures and group work with a variety of social events and excursions in Madrid, such as cultural visits and guided tours of emblematic areas of the city.

The Una Europa Europe and the World Winter School “Security Challenges for the EU in Turbulent Times” will take place from 9-13 February 2026, with an introductory online session on February 6. The contents and structure of that session will be communicated to all students in advance.

## General objectives of the Winter School:

- Strengthen the BAES programme of the Una Europa Alliance.
- Strengthen collaboration between BAES programme participants.
- Value the importance of transdisciplinarity and collaboration in scientific research.

## Specific academic objectives of the Winter School:

- Reflect on the tension between security and humanitarian imperatives in the current migration landscape.
- Assess the main difficulties in migration governance in view of the need to maintain a balance between security and protection.
- Reflect on the new defence challenges posed by current geopolitical instabilities.
- Assess the development of new defence plans alongside the role of European defence in an increasingly unstable geopolitical landscape.
- Analyse the main challenges arising from strategic dependence on raw materials and key elements in value chains in the EU.
- Assess ongoing regulatory changes aimed at strengthening energy security in the EU.

## Contents and dynamics of Working Groups:

After a Welcome Session (Monday 9, 10:00-11:00), students will be divided into three Working Groups (WGs), one for each of the three themes: Migration, Geostrategy and Defence, and Strategic Dependence and Energy Security. Students have been previously distributed in these three groups according to the preferences revealed in a previous online survey.

The first WG session, on Monday 3 (11:30-13:00), will be a Lecture outlining the policy landscape and the main challenges facing the topic in the corresponding Working Group. Subsequently, smaller working groups are formed in each working group, with 4-5 students each. Each WG will work on a case or issue presented by the teacher, in the general context of the working group's topic.

The remaining four sessions of the WGs will be devoted to developing the case and preparing a presentation, always with the assistance of the teachers.

The final session (Friday 13, 9:30- 11:30) will bring together all the students of the three WGs to share the main conclusions drawn from the work developed and the experiences from the Round Tables. In the first part of this final session, each WG will present the conclusions on the work developed, with a time limit of 5 minutes.
