


It is an open and borderless space for strategic reflection, innovation and experimentation in relation to the university of the future, which generates a unique inter-university environment.




# The impact of our work

Our role is to initiate and stimulate discussion. We leave the implementation of specific solutions to the different Working Groups, Clusters, and Self-Steering Committees. Our task is to inspire and provoke thought, even with creative elements like an animated poem or a cocktail metaphor.


Once the challenges and opportunities are selected, they are handed to the Visionary teams.

Fellows who are appointed to work freely on one challenge or opportunity, receive the name of Visionaries. They are specialists from within and outside of academia who shall offer innovative solutions to the problems.

The output (the Ideas Lab) produced can be a:

- Concept note
- Report
- Prototype
- Position paper

Once the Visionaries present an idea, the Design team takes the lead by assisting the relevant Una Europa bodies in the implementation process by providing consultation, advice, and feedback.
