Danielle Taylor is a researcher and teacher (maître de conference) in intercultural management and HR at Université Paris 1 Panthéon-Sorbonne. Her research focuses on group dynamics in global virtual teams. These interests stem from her international experiences having grown up in the U.S., living in France for over 12 years, and conducting regular projects with international colleagues from Canada to the Netherlands to Thailand.

Description:

How can we better understand each other from a cultural perspective? This interactive workshop will explore the concept of culture and use cultural dimensions – categories with which we can compare different cultures – as a tool to understand one another. By interacting with this tool, we will explore the similarities and differences within the group and compare this to national tendencies. Through exploration of this topic, you will be better equipped to understand the nuances of intercultural collaboration and communicate more efficiently and effectively at home and abroad.

Visit 1: Grande Galerie de l'Évolution at the Museum of Natural History and light festival at the Jardin des Plantes

Immerse yourself in the wonders of biodiversity at the Grande Galerie de l'Évolution, known for its grand glass roof and majestic animals seemingly frozen in time. Admission is free for visitors under 25 and €13 for others. After your visit, enjoy a peaceful stroll through the Jardin des Plantes, and if night has fallen, let yourself be enchanted by its seasonal light festival *“En voie d’illumination: Lumières de la nature.”*

Visit 2: Literary walk in Saint-Michel

Embark on a literary journey through the poetic heart of Saint-Michel, where the spirit of Parisian writers still lingers in the air. Step into the legendary Shakespeare & Company, a haven for readers and wanderers from around the world, and explore the charming San Francisco Books, filled with second-hand gems. To complete this timeless walk, you may visit the Sainte-Chapelle on Île de la Cité, whose stained-glass windows bathe the Gothic arches in celestial light (free for EU residents under 26, €13 otherwise).

Visit 3: 100 Years of Art Deco at the Museum of Decorative Arts

Explore the centenary exhibition celebrating Art Deco at the MAD, featuring a section dedicated to the legendary *Orient Express* and the re-creation of a 1926 Art Deco train cabin, including detailed models of the future train. This display offers a glimpse into both the glamour of the past and the innovation of modern craftsmanship. Admission is free for visitors under 26 and €15 for others. Continue your artistic journey with a visit to *La Samaritaine*, an architectural gem at the crossroads of Art Nouveau and Art Deco, renowned for its enchanting Christmas window displays.

Visit 4: Tyler Mitchell Exhibition at the Maison Européenne de la Photographie

Step into the luminous world of Tyler Mitchell at the Maison Européenne de la Photographie. His portraits and landscapes celebrate beauty, identity, and memory, blending dreamlike colour with intimate storytelling. After the visit, unwind over a drink in a vintage or jazz-inspired setting: either *Fréquence*, a lively bar and tapas spot known for its vinyl décor, or *Le 1905*, a hidden cocktail bar with the atmosphere of a Parisian jazz club.
