

Third Una Europa Staff Week: Diversity and Inclusion Universitá di Bologna – 16-20 October 2023 Call for applications

Alma Mater Studiorum Universitá di Bologna and the Una Europa Diversity Council are organizing the third Una Europa Staff Week, which will take place in Bologna from 16 to 20 October 2023.

We are now launching a call for participants for the Staff Week, which will be targeted to professionals working in the following areas:

- 1) Human resources, in particular services for inclusion of diversity and employment protection
- 2) Student services, in particular services for special needs, the right to study and the management of specific targets (for example: minorities, international students, diverse abilities, LGBTQI+ groups)
- 3) Any other administrative area working and providing services on diversity, equity and inclusion

The online call for applications is open from 5 June to 30 June¹

Participants will be selected by their home university, up to five per university. The selection will take place locally at each university by 31 July and selected participants will receive the confirmation of acceptance during August 2023, along with practical information on the programme and logistics aspects.

1. Goal

Diversity and Inclusion is one of the six transversal themes identified by Una.Futura and will guide all the actions of the project. The Staff Week has two goals in this regard: to train staff by raising awareness about these topics and to promote the work and vision of the Diversity Council. Through the provision of an adequate methodological framework, the staff training week will allow the sharing of good practices in addressing challenges in participants' daily work and nurture discussions on the theme of Diversity and Inclusion. By the end of the Staff Week, participants will have learned the theoretical structure proposed by the Diversity Council on the theme of Diversity and Inclusion. They will have engaged in discussions about the diversity management methodologies employed in the universities of the alliance and will have acquired awareness on the necessity of an intersectional approach. Moreover, participants will have exchanged good practices and will be equipped to find useful solutions for managing diversity efficiently and effectively in two strategic professional areas of an international European university:

- Human resources management
- Student services.

2. Practical information

The Staff Week will be delivered exclusively in person, with no online or hybrid options available. The total number of participants should not be less than 22.

Language requirements: The working language is English. We highly recommend at least a B2 level of proficiency in communication (according to the CEFR).

Accommodation: Selected participants will be responsible for arranging their own accommodation. The organizing university will share some practical information along with the acceptance notification in August at the latest.

Financing: the Una Europa Staff Week is free of charge for participants. Travel and subsistence costs, including accommodation, local transportation, and dinners, can be reimbursed using the institutional Una.Futura budget or other sources of funding, such as Erasmus+ STT funds.
