

We identify **fundamental problems** connected to the functioning of the universities and appoint **visionary** teams, consisting of creative specialists from within and outside of academia, to offer innovative solutions to the problems. These visionary ideas are translated into workable, scalable, and translatable formats by teams of **designers**.



Visionaries


The teams of visionaries will be appointed to work on particular issues. They will be given the freedom to dream and think truly out of the box.

Designers

The teams of designers, will consist mainly of professionals from the Una Europa partners and will be tasked with the crucial "reality check" for the dream scenarios.


